14. masculine (adj)—having the characteristics of a man

Women love Brad Pitt because they think he's handsome and very masculine.

15. peer (n)—person of your same age or class

16. pressure (n)—feeling you must do something, stress

17. race (n)—a competition to see who can do something the best or fastest

19. sign (n)—a signal, show If someone talks unclearly, it may be a sign that they are drunk.

20. sociologist (n)—a person who studies society, groups

21. taboo (n)—something forbidden, strongly against the rules in a society It is taboo in the United States to eat a cat or dog.

22. **tease** (v)—to bother, but in a joking style

Throughout time, prostitution has been part of most societies.

24. uniform (n)—clothes everyone in a group must wear
